From the Pastor's Desk

God of grace, you have given us minds to know you, hearts to love you, and voices to sing your praise. Fill us with your Spirit, that we may celebrate your glory and worship you in spirit and in truth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Happy Birthday Church! Pentecost is the day we celebrate the day the church was born by the power of the Holy Spirit! The day when God's power exploded through the church and officially began its mission of making disciples.

Pentecost is no isolated event. It is the culmination of the mighty work of salvation Jesus began on Good Friday. Pentecost is the season of fire, the fire of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is the season of wind, the wind of the Spirit that blows and gusts its way into the hearts of those who committed to God and his Kingdom.

Scripture describes Jesus as the "Chief Cornerstone" of our faith. ... Isaiah 28:16, "Therefore this says the Lord God: 'Behold, I lay in Zion a stone for a foundation, a tried stone, a precious cornerstone, a sure foundation.

Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, ²¹ in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, ²² in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit. [Ephesians 2:20-22].

During the Pentecost season, let us respond to the outpouring of God's great Spirit, and determine as individuals and a collective body of faith that it is time for us to act like Pentecost people. If you want to set someone on fire, you must burn a little yourself. Where is the Spirit? Can you feel it? Amen.

HIGHLIGHTS OF SESSION MEETING – MAY 12, 2020

- Once again, we had perfect attendance at the Session meeting, compliments of Zoom technology and Elder Jim Roselli.
- Beginning Sunday, June 7, we will have virtual communion during the worship service. Those at home will be advised to have bread and juice ready to take part, as Pastor Lindsey shares the communion liturgy.
- A motion was carried to authorize Elder Roselli to purchase and install three indoor security cameras, one in the Narthex, one in the Parish Hall, and one outside the church office. The cost is approximately \$90 each.
- It was noted that we now have a "Coffee Hour Chat" immediately after online worship, and that it is an excellent way to stay connected with the pastor and other church members.
- Attendance at worship, as counted by views of the online worship, averaged 51 during April.
- Plans were made to distribute the remaining Operation Backpack food in front of the church, as we have not been successful in getting it to the students, since school has been on remote learning.
- Session viewed an excellent video created by the New Jersey Missional Transitional Working Group. The seven Presbyteries of New Jersey are being re-imagined. Elder Roselli is serving on the Working Group.
- Pastor Lindsey continues to shelter at home, preparing and recording worship services, coordinating worship with Jim Roselli and Quinn, keeping in touch with members by phone and keeping in touch with Greta, who comes to the office one day a week, working from home the other days.
- The next regular Session meeting will be on Monday, June 8, 2020.

MISSION UPDATE

Elizabeth Presbytery sent a grant of \$1,000 to every church in the Presbytery, to be used as each church's Session decided. Our Session decided to direct the funds toward feeding people in need. El Centro Hispanoamericano in Plainfield has been providing food to a large number of families during the pandemic. WAPC's \$1000 grant has been sent to El Centro to assist in their feeding program.

Operation Backpack has been suspended until schools reopen, because of the difficulty in getting the weekend food bags to the students. Last Thursday we distributed the remaining bags of food in front of WAPC. We informed El Centro and posted the food giveaway on the North Plainfield Community Facebook page, and we had a good response. A small amount of food that remained was taken to St. Joseph's Church for their Saturday morning distribution. Thank you to Susan Durick and Julia and Ellen Lake for their assistance.
