John 14:27 (NIV) Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you!

Stated Clerk Rev. Jeremy Campbell thought it was time the Elizabeth Presbytery addressed the issue of the recent violence in America in prayer and I totally agree because it reflects my feelings about what Jesus has been pleading with us during this Pentecostal season reflected in the Gospel of Luke telling us to simply love one another as He loves us.

So, in response to the recent incident of white supremacist terror which was committed by a man with a clearly articulated anti-immigrant agenda in the form of a mass shooting at a Walmart in El Paso, Texas, and later in Dayton, Ohio, Jill Duffield, editor of the Presbyterian Outlook, offered a beautiful prayer to share with congregations.

Jill writes: "Enough, Lord God, enough. Rend our hearts and restore your goodness and mercy in our land. Through you, all things are possible, and yet we fail to claim your power to transform chaos into order, war into peace, and anger into action. We pray yet again, Lord God, yet again for your children cut down in a hail of gunfire, for families devastated, communities decimated, our country reeling from self-inflicted wounds of hate. We beg your forgiveness for our unwillingness to address the soul-sickness of our nation, the idolatry of guns and our infatuation with violence and anger and hatred. Comfort those who mourn. Heal the hurting. Strengthen the helpers. Grant courage to your people that we may not just say enough but do all we can, and everything required to stop the killing in our streets." Enough said, Amen.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS – JULY 8, 2019

- A motion was approved to hold Sunday morning worship in the lounge/parlor during the hot
 weather-- July, August and the first two weeks of September. Elder Roselli will work out the
 details for streaming the service.
- A new Keurig coffee maker is now available for Sunday coffee hours.
- The hearing assistance device was purchased at a cost of \$1,425 instead of the \$1,600 originally
 quoted, because a discount was applied for houses of worship. Money from the Living Memorial
 Fund was used for the purchase.
- The Boy Scout troop WAPC sponsors painted the rolling bulletin boards on Saturday, June 15th.
- The next regular Session meeting will be on Monday, September 9. We have not scheduled a regular meeting for August.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS – AUGUST 18, 2019

- We did not have a regular Session meeting scheduled for the month of August, but Session met informally after worship on August 18th.
- Because we did not have rental fees from the Barack Obama Charter High School in July and August, it was necessary to transfer additional funds from WAPC's investment accounts to the operating account to cover two payroll periods.
- Several ideas for the future were discussed, including the possibility of having a beginning Spanish class for English speakers. Would you be interested in participating in a half-hour lesson on Sundays after worship?
- The next regular Session meeting will be on Monday, September 9.


ZUCCHINI, EGGPLANT AND PEPPERS – OH MY!


