# Letter from the Desk of Pastor Lindsey

"Eternal God, you have called us to be members of one body. Join us with those who in all times and places have praised your name, that with one heart and mind, we may show the unity of your church, and bring honor to our Lord Savior, Jesus Christ." Amen.

This prayer really resonates because February is designated as Black History month. And I often refer to Galatians 3:28 New International Version (NIV):

<sup>28</sup> There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

Yes, God has truly called us to be members of one body. He sent his beloved son, Jesus Christ to let us know that his love is shared with everyone. But, in today's climate of recent attacks on immigrants and other minorities, I wonder how God and Jesus must be feeling about what they see and hear.

It reminds me of the famous "I Have a Dream" public speech that was delivered by American civil rights activist Martin Luther King Jr. during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom on August 28, 1963, in which he called for civil and economic rights and an end to racism in the United States.

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF SESSION MEETING – JANUARY 14, 2019

- Al Smith informed Session that he and Tom Ledder will be retiring from coordination of the CROP Walk after over 30 years. He is looking for interest in our church membership to continue coordination of the Plainfield-North Plainfield Walk.
- The agreement with Intuit to handle the church's payroll and tax reporting was finalized. The cost will be \$57/month for the first 3 months, and \$125/month thereafter.
- Elder Bob Goellner has been working with the Borough inspector and Borough engineer,
   examining the drainage situation of the building, to come up with a solution.
- Pledges for 2018 were about \$67,000. This year pledges are expected to be about \$54,000.
- Pastor Lindsey reported that the Synod of the Northeast has plans to redistribute the New Jersey Presbyteries, with the possibility of mergers. The Synod will pay for training of professional leaders. Changes will take place in 2020.
- Session voted to authorize celebrating Holy Communion every First Sunday as well as Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- The Hospitality team will plan a brunch for the Annual Congregational meeting on Sunday,
   February 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- Elder Roselli asks that we all sit in the front pews, so the church doesn't look empty when the worship service is streamed.
- A motion was passed to purchase a small media player for Bob Monteith to be able to hear the audio sermons. Cost is about \$100, which will come from funds previously donated for Bob.
- The Live Nativity on December 23<sup>rd</sup> was very successful. Thanks to Jim Durick for building the stable, to Susan Durick for renting the animals, and to Pastor Madelynne, Bob Goellner, Ellen Lake and Carmen Camey from Iglesia de Dios Vida Nueva for reading the Christmas Story. Liz Kendall did a great job organizing and costuming the children.
- The Nominating Committee will be looking for 2 or 3 new elders to serve on Session. Summary by Gwyn Gronlund, Clerk of Session

#### FOOD FOR BACKPACK PROGRAM



Currently those children in the program in grades K through 4 receive food items for their backpacks on Fridays. This helps them through the weekend, when they are not receiving meals at school. The older children are not currently served by the program. Approximately 25 children have been identified by the school system. We have already received a large donation of individual cereal packs from the Obama School. We are asking folks who belong to Costco or BJ's to purchase and donate individually packed items from the following list. 
