

HIGHLIGHTS OF SESSION MEETING – AUGUST 9, 2020

- In July, we had one virtual worship and three in-person worships. Two were in the Sanctuary and one in the Mullens' backyard. Attendance at worship, including YouTube views, averaged 22 per Sunday.
- The disclaimer of liability must be added to the contracts for all our renters. This disclaimer must be signed by all using the church building, to waive liability in case someone contracts the Covid-19 virus after being in the WAPC building.
- Pastor Lindsey will record video sermons for viewing during in-person worship on August 16 and 23. A children's sermon will be recorded by Dave Lyttle. On August 30 and September 6 (Labor Day Sunday), worship prepared by Elizabeth Presbytery will be accessed from WAPC website.
- Indoor security cameras have been purchased and will be installed by Jim Roselli.
- The dinner and concert planned as a fundraiser for Operation Backpack cannot be held in-person due to Covid-19 restrictions. Instead, a virtual concert is being planned, to be recorded live with Quinn and several other musicians and "pledge breaks."
- There is mold downstairs on the wall opposite the girls' room, and a small leak which may be from the boiler room. Greta has contacted someone to evaluate the problem.
- The north side of the digital sign is not working. We are waiting for repair.

CROP Walk – Pandemic Style

This year's CROP Walk (Number 48) is planned for **Sunday**, **October 18**, **2020**. That's just a little over 6 weeks away!

In the spring, at the height of Covid-19,

Church World Service urged all CROP Walk planners of Spring walks to go virtual. The walk coordinators didn't have much time, but they pulled it off beautifully!

We are blessed to have more time to transition. There have been several Zoom meetings provided by CWS, and we have been able to benefit from the Spring walkers' experience.

The way the Virtual Walk works is that we encourage every walker to register on the CROP page for the Plainfield/North Plainfield Walk. Walkers then can receive online donations. Last year several of our walkers did register online and were surprised to receive donations totaling \$670, with very little effort.

Anyone who wants to ask for sponsors in the traditional way, certainly may do so. Those who are walking the 5K may walk individually, in a family group, or in a small group. Walkers may walk at their convenience. Also, someone who wants to participate, but can't walk the distance, can modify with a shorter distance. More detailed information will be coming soon.

There will not be a kick off, with all the walkers assembling in front of WAPC, as in previous years.

The 2019 CROP Walk, which was Number 47 for Plainfield/North Plainfield, received donations of about \$4,400. That is an amazing total, achieved by 22 walkers from 8 churches. We think we can do even better this year, with a combination of traditional and virtual walkers and sponsors.


